

Analysis of Student Feedback

Through the analysis of student feedback forms it is observed that major issues raised by the students are-

- 1. Shortage of subject related books in library which leads to unavailability of books in time.
- 2. Shortage of classrooms
- 3. Lack of proper electricity in some classrooms.
- 4. Urgent need of washroom for girls.
- 5. Lack of sufficient drinking water supply.
- 6. Need of library in departments.
- 7. More practical equipments are needed in science subject.
- 8. SMS facilities must be started for PG students to disseminate important notices and information.
- **9.** Students are satisfied regarding teaching learning process, teacher student relation, punctuality, availability and sincerity of teachers and quality of teaching.
- 10. Many students have urged to start research in college at earliest.

Analysis of Employees Feedback

The employees of CMP degree college, Allahabad are facing some problems.

- 1. In infrastructure, more classrooms, separate washrooms for faculties and students, individual chambers for faculties with furniture, common rooms for girls, reading room in library etc. are required.
- 2. There is a big issue of pure and drinkable water in departments.
- **3.** There should be proper supply of power for instruments, lab apparatus and presentations. Power fluctuation disturbs all these and proper running of classes.
